Artemis Michailidou was born in Athens. She graduated from the Department of English Studies at the University of Athens in 1996, earning, a year later, a full postgraduate scholarship from the Hellenic State Scholarships' Foundation (IKY), with which she financed her MA in English Literature at the University of Warwick (1998), and her PhD in American Cultural Studies at the University of Exeter (2002). Her doctoral dissertation focused on the reassessment of Edna St. Vincent Millay's poetry and its influence on the younger generation of American women poets. In 2012 she obtained a second MA (in Creative Writing) from the University of Western Macedonia, and was awarded a scholarship for being ranked 1st in the above University's admission exams. She graduated with distinction, submitting a thesis on literary translation and, specifically, on Ali Smith's "The First Person and Other Stories".

Dr. Michailidou has been working at the Hellenic Military Academy as Assistant Professor in English Language and Literature since 2010, obtaining tenure in 2013 (Government Gazette 1120 τ . $\Gamma'/02$ -10-2013). In 2022 she was promoted to the rank of Associate Professor (Government Gazette 396 τ . $\Gamma'/24$ -02-2022). She also teaches, as Associate Instructor, at the Hellenic Open University's postgraduate program in Creative Writing.

She has also worked at the University of Athens (as fixed-term Lecturer), and at the University of Exeter (first as Teaching Assistant and then as Recognized Teacher). Following the completion of a rigorous training program, she was awarded certification as Associate Teacher by the Staff and Educational Development Association (SEDA), one of the main UK accreditation bodies for academic staff.

Her publications include two textbooks on English Military Terminology, currently taught at the Hellenic Military Academy, as well as a variety of articles, translations and book reviews in prestigious academic journals (e.g. *Journal of American Studies*, Comparative *American Studies*, *Feminist Review*, *European Journal of American Culture*). Her research enjoys international recognition, with specific articles included in the syllabus of postgraduate programs in the UK.

Dr. Michailidou also reviews articles for Routledge and Addleton Academic Publishers, and she participates regularly in international conferences on American Literature, Cultural Studies, and Creative Writing.
